ORDINANCE NO. 2009-2

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE USE OF GOLF CARTS ON THE STREETS IN THE TOWN OF MONROE, INDIANA.

WHEREAS, the Indiana Legislature recently passed legislation authorizing the regulation of golf carts by a local authority.

WHEREAS, the Monroe Town Council recognizes that residents of the Town desire to operate their golf carts on the streets of the Town.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MONROE, ADAMS COUNTY, INDIANA:

- 1. For purposes of this Ordinance, "golf cart" shall mean a four (4) wheeled motor vehicle (gas or electric) originally and specifically designed and intended to transport one (1) or more individuals and golf clubs for the purpose of playing the game of golf on a golf course.
- 2. Only persons who possess a valid operator's license to operate a motor vehicle shall be permitted to operate a golf cart on the streets located within the Town of Monroe as further restricted herein.
- 3. Golf carts may not be operated on Highway 124 in the Town of Monroe except for the purpose of perpendicularly crossing said highway.
- 4. Golf carts operated on the streets in the Town of Monroe must display a slow moving vehicle emblem or a red or amber flashing light at the rear of the golf cart.

- 5. Golf carts may only be operated on the streets in the Town of Monroe during daylight hours unless the golf cart is equipped with at least two (2) permanently-mounted headlights which are visible from a distance of not less than five hundred (500) feet.
- 6. All golf carts operated in the Town of Monroe pursuant to this Ordinance must be covered by an insurance policy providing not less than the minimum coverage required for motor vehicles operated in the State of Indiana.
- 7. A person who violates this Ordinance shall be assessed a fine in the amount of $\frac{50}{}$.
